distressing news lifted verbatim from a letter from Stephen Scobie

"I'd like to ask your assistance in making as widely known as possible a disgraceful affair now going on in Britain. Ian Hamilton Finlay made an arrangement some time ago with a small outfit in London called Fulcrum Press - a so-called "non-commercial" publisher, which puts out Basil Bunting & other vaguely avant-garde stuff - to republish his book THE DANCERS INHERIT THE PARTY, early pre-concrete poems, first published by Migrant Press in 1960. God knows how the contract was rigged, but it has left him without any control or legal comeback against Fulcrum. They have published the book in a format he does not approve of (you know how perfectionist Wild Hawthorn publications are technically) & which John Matthias described as looking like a proof copy. The book does not list any of his other works; there are errors in the text of the poems which Fulcrum has refused to correct; the poems have been deliberately misdated; & the whole thing describes itself as a first edition, which it is not. The whole thing is a botched & fraudulent attempt to make a fast buck at the author's expense. Finlay is fighting like hell, but legally he seems to have very little chance - his only weapon is publicity; and he tells me that all his acquaintances in the London literary scene, altruistic young men who write highly moral poems about Vietnam, refuse to support him, jabbering about "expediency" and "oversensitivity" - i.e. all running scared of offending any publisher in case their precious poems don't get into print. Fulcrum meanwhile responds with any insubt they can lay hold of - Bunting is now distributing a statement calling Finlay "warped, unreliable, vain, hysterical, etc etc. Could you - please - circulate this story as much as possible, DON'T buy the book, make sure that nobody thinks they're getting genuine Finlay if they do buy it, etc. And if you have any contacts with little magazines in London, get them to do something about it too. It is intolerable that the work of an artist of Finlay's standing should be perverted in this way - and it is in the interest of poets & writers everywhere to get rid of publishers as corrupt and irresponsible as this. Which means, hit them where it hurts, in the sales - don't buy ANY of their goddamn books. (If you think I sound angry, you should read Finlay's letters!)"
